They should be:


- •Reading everyday, from a selection of narrative and non-fiction texts.

Maths:

In Maths we will be exploring the following:

- Recognise and find angles
- Refection and Translation
- Multiplying Fractions
- Dividing Proper Fractions by Whole Numbers
- Solving Fraction Problems

English:

- Whole school narrative unit linked to Hermelin—letter writing, diary entry, short story
- Narrative writing (fairy-tales) linked to 'Blackberry Blue.
- In guided reading we will be reading 'Cosima Unfortunate.'
- Continuing to recap known spelling rules and learn trickier spelling patterns.
- Use VIPERS reading skills to respond to a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Science: A Focus on Enquiry types.

PSHE: Healthy Me

- Are motivated to care for their own physical and emotional health.

In this unit you will learn:

History: Ancient Egypt.

- To know how society was organised in Ancient Egypt.
- To find out why the pharaohs were important.
- To know the different Gods and Goddesses the Ancient Egyptians believed in.
- To know how and why pyramids were created.
- To know the different inventions created and used in Ancient Egypt

Design and Technology: Making Burgers

- To evaluate how healthy a burger is based on its nutrition label.
- To compare different burgers and assess which is healthiest.
- To explain some of the different ways in which burger patties are cooked.
- To follow a recipe to make a beef, turkey or vegetable burger patty.
- To add ingredients to a basic burger patty to reflect global cuisine.
- To follow a recipe to make different burger sauces, including salsa, tzatziki and barbecue sauce.
- To design a burger menu to incorporate different patties, sides and sauces.
- To explore, taste and assess different types of bread and their suitability for a burger bun.
- To offer suggestions for some alternatives for bread.

PE: Netball

- To develop accuracy when throwing a ball at a fixed or moving target.
- To use effective control to pass the ball eg bounce-chest-over arm.
- To be able to move the ball with accuracy and pace.
- To be able to catch and distribute the ball with effective accuracy.
- To identify spatial awareness and to move their body ready to receive the ball.

RE: What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?

Within this unit, pupils will study the 'big story' of the Bible, explaining the place of incarnation and salvation. They will study accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection comparing their thoughts with the different ways that Christians may interpret these texts.

French: Al'Ecole - At school
